5 Confessions by Aidan R. Vogel

This is a short piece for Woodwind quintet and Piano, each confession gives the focus to a different section of the Quintet, as well as utilizing different compositional techniques.

The Cotard Delusion by Alexander Stewart

The Cotard Delusion is a rare mental illness in which the affected person holds the delusional belief that they are already dead, do not exist, are putrefying, or have lost their blood or internal organs. The patient afflicted with this mental illness usually denies his or her existence, the existence of a certain body part, or the existence of a portion of their body. Like this piece, Cotard's Delusion exists in three stages: (i) Germination stage—the symptoms of psychotic depression and of hypochondria appear; (ii) Blooming stage—the full development of the syndrome and the delusions of negation; and (iii) Chronic stage—continued, severe delusions along with chronic psychiatric depression.
